

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LIBERTY, CENTRE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, PROHIBITING THE BURNING OF GARBAGE OR RUBBISH WITH THE EXCEPTION OF ATTENDED FIRES FOR THE BURNING OF PAPER, CARDBOARD, PRUNINGS, AND LEAVES, SETTING REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF SUCH FIRES AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF, EXEMPTING COOKING, RECREATIONAL AND LIGHTING FIRES.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Township of Liberty, Centre County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of same as follows:

SECTION I

It shall be unlawful to burn any garbage or rubbish within the Township of Liberty except for the burning of paper, cardboard, prunings from trees and shrubery and leaves.

SECTION II

Any such fires where paper, cardboard, leaves and prunings are burned shall be attended by an adult. Any fires or burnings permitted by this Ordinance are prohibited during the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. prevailing time.

SECTION III

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance shall upon conviction before a district magistrate be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) and costs of prosecution, or in default of payment of such fines and costs to undergo imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days.

SECTION IV

Recreational and cooking fires such as barbeques, campfires, and the like; as well as decorative lighting fires such as torches and the like, shall be exempt from the within Ordinance and the terms

and provisions of the within Ordinance shall not apply thereto.

ORDINANCE NO. 15

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LIBERTY, CENTRE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 18, OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LIBERTY, BY EXTENDING THE PROHIBITED HOURS FOR BURNING OF LEAVES AND REFUSE IN THE TOWNSHIP.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Township of Liberty, Centre County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained that Section II of Ordinance 18 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Any such fires ^{it} were paper, cardboard, leaves and prunings are burned shall be attended by an adult. Any fires or burnings ^N permitted by this Ordinance are prohibited on Wednesdays and Sundays, and at all other days during the hours of 7:00 P.M. and 7:00 A.M. prevailing time.

This amendment to Ordinance 18 is hereby enacted and ordained as an Ordinance of the Township of Liberty this 22nd day of November, 1982.

PART 1

OUTDOOR BURNING

§101. UNLAWFUL BURNING.

It shall be unlawful to burn any garbage or rubbish within the Township of Liberty except for the burning of paper, cardboard, prunings from trees and shrubbery and leaves. The term "burning" shall include both flames and smoke. All paper and cardboard are to be burned in a fireproof container.

§102. DESIGNATED TIMES FOR BURNING.

Any such fires where paper, cardboard, leaves and prunings are burned shall be attended by an adult. Any fires or burnings permitted by this Part are prohibited on Sundays and on all other days during the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., the following day, prevailing time.

§103. PENALTIES.

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Part, upon conviction thereof in an action brought before a district justice in the manner provided for the enforcement of summary offenses under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to a term of imprisonment not to exceed ninety (90) days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues or each Section of this Part which shall be found to have been violated shall constitute a separate offense.

§104. RECREATIONAL AND COOKING FIRES.

Recreational and cooking fires, such as barbecues, campfires, and the like, as well as decorative lighting fires such as torches and the like, shall be exempt from the within Part and the terms and provisions of this Part shall not apply thereto.
